

# McDonald: 'Nammo intends to keep facility in Perry'

exit the commoditized energetics businesses in November 2018. "In November 2018 we announced the future focus of our energetics segment would be on our niche energetic devices and materials businesses in Chicago, Scotland and Norway," Chemring stated in a company press release. "Businesses in Derby (United Kingdom) and Perry, Florida were treated as discontinued in the 2018 financial statements."

"In April we announced the sale of Chemring Military Products in Florida, and in June we announced the sale of Chemring Defence UK Limited in Derby. We have today announced that a conditional agreement has been entered into for the sale of our Florida-based subsidiary Chemring Ordnance, Inc. to Nammo Defense Systems Inc. for a cash consideration of \$17 million," Chemring stated. "The sale, which is subject to regulatory approval by the U.S. authorities, is expected to complete no later than the end of Q2 FY20. This

transaction is another step in the delivery of our strategy and provides a greater focus on our growing and differentiated positions in Sensors & Information and Countermeasures & Energetics," the Chemring release stated. "Today's announcement concludes the process of exiting the Group's commoditized energetics businesses and further improves the quality of Chemring and its earnings." Under Nammo, the local plant should remain one of Taylor County's top employers thanks to ongoing

and projected manufacturing contracts with the U.S. military, McDonald said. The local manufacturing facility designs, develops and produces various pyrotechnic devices, ordnance and munition components for military, homeland security and first responders. According to McDonald, the local Chemring plant manufactures Anti-Personnel Obstacle Breaching Systems (APOBS) land mine clearing devices, anti-IED devices, pyrotechnic delays (hand grenade fuses) and other

munitions. The local Chemring Ordnance plant employed approximately 200 employees in May of this year and was expected to hire an additional 100-125 workers to fulfill a new APOBS contract with the U.S. government. Nammo Defense Systems, Inc. is a subsidiary of Nammo (short for Nordic Ammunition Company) a Norwegian/Finnish aerospace and defense group that specialized in the

production of ammunition, rocket engines and space applications. The company has subsidiaries in Finland, Germany, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland, Spain, Australia, the United Kingdom, the United States and Canada. Nammo produces missiles and missile propulsion systems, small, medium and large caliber ammunition, propellant charges for artillery and mortars, artillery shell bodies, hand grenades and warheads.

featured just 21 players before Head Coach Beau Johnson promoted junior-varsity players following their season. Many starters play on offense, defense and special teams, as the Tigers employ the Wing-T with multiple sets on offense and they run to the ball until the whistle blows on defense.

The Tigers' rushing attack also includes Garrett Martin (62 carries, 261 yards, 5 TDs) and Javian Rives (30 carries, 263 yards, 2 TDs). Tiger QB Logan Pumphrey has completed 33 of 54 passes for 681 yards to go along with 15 touchdowns. Smith is Blountstown's leading receiver with eight catches for 242 yards -- seven of which resulted in touchdowns. Pola McCloud has snagged five passes for 140 yards and three touchdowns. The offensive line is anchored by college prospects Carson Hatchett and Joseph Rector, while Zeb Kelley leads the defense with 108 tackles.

Robert Glanton has carried the ball 54 times for 495 yards and six touchdowns, as well as snagging 26 passes for 450 yards and four touchdowns.
