recruit plaintiffs to take part in the class action suit against those who make and distribute the highlyaddictive prescription opioids. Gainesville attorney Rod Smith, of Avera & Smith, LLP, contacted Bishop. The ultimately commission

voted 4-0 to join the suit. Under the terms of the contingent fee retainer

agreement, the law firms included in the "applicant team" will receive 10% of the gross amount recovered if the claims are settled prior to filing a complaint, 20% if claims are settled prior to the first day of trial, 22.5% of the gross amount recovered after a trial and 25% recovered after any post-judgment

If the applicant team does not make any recovery for the county, the county

will not be responsible for reimbursing the applicant team for any costs incurred

in prosecuting the case. The payment of fees is entirely contingent upon the applicant team recovering money for the county. If the applicant team makes no recovery, the county is not responsible for paying any

Bishop is expected to provide another update to the commission at its Monday, Dec. 9 meeting.
