

### EARLY NOTICE AND PUBLIC REVIEW OF A PROPOSED ACTIVITY IN A 100-YEAR FLOODPLAIN AND WETLAND

 This is to give notice that the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) has been awarded funds through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) program to support long-term recovery efforts for Hurricane Michael-impacted communities. In Florida, CDBG-DR funds are administered through the Rebuild Florida program. Rebuild Florida connects eligible Floridians with federal disaster recovery funding, prioritizing the most-impacted communities and the most vulnerable low- and moderate-income individuals, including the elderly, those with disabilities and

families with young children. DEO is preparing to launch Rebuild Florida programs in Hurricane Michael-impacted communities.  
 This notice is required by Section 2(a)(4) of Executive Order 11988 for Floodplain Management and by Section 2(b) of Executive Order 11990 for the Protection of Wetlands and is implemented by HUD Regulations found at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C for the HUD action that is within and/or affects a floodplain or wetland. The notice is related to making determinations on floodplain management and to ascertain the potential effect that its activity in a floodplain will have on the human environment for the Rebuild Florida program.  
 Construction may be undertaken in the 100-year floodplain and/or wetlands. DEO is interested in alternatives and public perceptions of possible adverse impacts that could result from the project, as well as potential mitigation measures. Through Rebuild Florida, work may be performed on properties located within the floodplain area. At this time, the exact number and locations of the properties to participate in the program are unspecified. However, eligible applicants are homeowners whose primary residence was damaged by Hurricane Michael within the following communities, including the number of acres in a 100-year floodplain within those communities:  
 Bay County (218,809.17 acres), Calhoun County (140,041.60 acres), Franklin County (276,354.83 acres), Gadsden County (68,869.70 acres), Gulf County (289,199.82 acres), Holmes County (120,385.34 acres), Jackson County (122,185.61 acres), Leon County (150,202.67 acres), Liberty County (341,752.80 acres), Taylor County (765,134.96 acres), Wakulla County (206,571.67 acres) and Washington County (123,879.25 acres). In total, approximately 2,823,387.44 acres are within the 100-year floodplain.  
 The Rebuild Florida program will consist of the following activities:

- Repair to, reconstruction or replacement of housing units damaged by Hurricane Michael, which may include building code compliance and mitigation against future storm impacts, including elevation.
- The completion of work to homes that have been partially repaired.
- Repairs to or replacement of manufactured, modular and mobile homes impacted by Hurricane Michael.
- Temporary housing assistance based on individual homeowner needs and their participation in the Housing Repair and Replacement Program.
- Program housing assistance based on individual tenant needs and their participation in the Housing Repair and Replacement Program.
- Acquisition of substantially-damaged housing units for housing redevelopment or buyout of substantially-damaged properties may also be considered.

For properties located in the floodplain, one of the following options may be administered:  
 Option A: Homes to be rebuilt in their original location are to be elevated adhering to the federal and/or state requirements.  
 Option B: Homes damaged may be relocated to a new area within the current developed property with

possible elevation per floodplain requirement.  
 Option C: Refer the homeowner to the Voluntary Home Buyout Program.  
 There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and/or wetlands and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Commenters are encouraged to offer alternative sites outside of the floodplain or wetland, alternative methods to serve the same project purpose, and methods to minimize and mitigate impacts. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public education tool. The dissemination of information and request for public comment about floodplains or wetlands can facilitate and enhance federal efforts to reduce the risks and impacts associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplains or wetlands, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk.

 Esto es para avisar que el Departamento de Oportunidades Económicas de Florida (DEO) por sus siglas en inglés) ha recibido fondos a través del programa de Recuperación De Desastres y Subvenciones de Desarrollo Comunitario (CDBG-DR) por sus siglas en inglés) del Departamento de Vivienda y Desarrollo Urbano de los Estados Unidos (HUD por sus siglas en inglés) para apoyar los esfuerzos de recuperación a largo plazo para las comunidades que fueron afectadas por el huracán Michael. En Florida, los fondos CDBG-DR se administran a través del programa Reconstruir la Florida. Reconstruir la Florida conecta a las personas de Florida que son elegibles

DEO se está preparando para lanzar el programa Reconstruir la Florida en las comunidades afectadas por el huracán Michael.  
 Esta notificación es requerida por la Sección 2(a)(4) de la Orden Ejecutiva 11988 para la administración de las llanuras inundables y por la sección 2(b) de la Orden Ejecutiva 11990 para la protección de humedales y es implementada por los reglamentos de HUD que se encuentran en 24 CFR 55.20 Subparte C para la acción de HUD que se encuentra dentro y / o afecta a una llanura inundable o a un humedal. El aviso está relacionado con la toma de decisiones sobre el manejo de las llanuras inundables y para determinar el efecto potencial que su actividad en una llanura inundable tendrá sobre el ambiente humano para el programa Reconstruir la Florida.  
 La construcción puede llevarse a cabo en una llanura inundable de 100 años y / o humedales. - La finalización de trabajos previamente hechos a viviendas parcialmente reparadas.
- Reparación o sustitución de casas prefabricadas, modulares y móviles impactadas por el huracán Michael.
- Asistencia para vivienda temporal basada en la necesidad individual del propietario y su participación en el Programa de

Reparación y Reemplazo de la Vivienda.  
 • Asistencia para vivienda temporal basada en las necesidades individuales de los inquilinos y en su participación en el programa de Reparación y Reemplazo de Vivienda.  
 • También se puede recibir consideración sobre la adquisición de unidades de viviendas sustancialmente afectadas para realizar la reconstrucción in situ o adquirir propiedades cuando las originales estén sustancialmente afectadas.  
 Para las propiedades ubicadas en la llanura inundable, se puede administrar una de las siguientes opciones:  
 Opción A: las casas que se reconstruyan en su ubicación original se elevarán de acuerdo con los requisitos federales y / o estatales.  
 Opción B: las viviendas afectadas pueden ubicarse en una nueva área dentro de la propiedad actual desarrollada con posible elevación, según los requerimientos de la llanura inundable.  
 Opción C: referir al propietario del hogar al Programa de Compra Voluntaria de la Vivienda.  
 Este aviso tiene tres propósitos principales. En primer lugar, otorgar a las personas que puedan ser afectadas por las actividades realizadas en las llanuras inundables y / o humedales, y las que tengan interés en proteger el medio ambiente natural la oportunidad de expresar sus preocupaciones y ofrecer información acerca de esas zonas. Se recomienda a los comentaristas que ofrezcan sitios alternativos fuera de la llanura inundable o el humedal, métodos alternativos para cumplir el mismo propósito del proyecto y métodos para minimizar y mitigar los impactos. En segundo lugar, un programa de aviso público adecuado puede ser una importante herramienta para la educación pública. La difusión de la información y la solicitud de comentarios públicos sobre llanuras inundables o humedales pueden facilitar y mejorar los esfuerzos federales para reducir los riesgos e impactos asociados con la ocupación y modificación de estas áreas especiales. En tercer lugar, para ser justos, cuando el gobierno federal determina que participará en acciones que tienen lugar en llanuras inundables o humedales, debe informar a quienes pueden estar en mayor riesgo o en un riesgo continuo.
