CHAPTER EIGHT

After I was released to return to my unit, I spent about two weeks in our rear area.

The 1st Battalion was still located in I-Corps at the time, and we were on LZ Sharon, just outside the city limits of Quang Tri City.

I still had stitches in my scalp, and while I was up and mobile, I was given several small tasks in the form of "light duty."

I retrieved the steel pot that had saved my life and placed it with the rest of my personal things, mostly war souvenirs that I would take home when I finished my year in country.

The things I had collected included the T53 Chinese boltaction rifle I claimed when our squad located that arms cache out west of LZ Pedro, my steel pot with the very large dent that I was wearing when I was shot, a few North Vietnamese coins and a compass with Vietnamese writing on it.

One thing I found very odd was the fact that my steel pot would no longer fit over my head -- even without the liner installed!

The dent, resembling half of a softball, was simply pushed in so far that my head would no longer fit.

That helped explain the twoweek long headache.

Eventually my stitches were removed, and I was getting close to returning to active duty, which would mean heading back to the field.

I was reading the bulletin board one day when I noticed a posting for an engineer position on a PBR in Quin Nhon Harbor. PBR stood for "Patrol Boat River," as well as for Pabst Blue Ribbon beer, but in this case, it is the former we are talking about.

I asked our officer of the day if I could bid on it, and he asked if I had any experience with boats.

I told him I was from the Florida Gulf Coast, where everyone had a boat, knowing that if given the chance I could fake it until I had the position.

I did not want to go back to the infantry unit, humping all day and sleeping in the mud.

I was allowed to place my name in contention for the engineer position on the PBR, and of the two of us that bid on the job, I was selected because I had been in Vietnam for one day longer.

By this time, I had been in country for almost nine months, all of it spent with A Company, 1st of the 8th Cavalry.

My days primarily consisted of waking up in the morning behind a foxhole that I dug the night before, eating a breakfast of C-rations and moving out

through some the most of inhospitable terrain on earth. Sometimes we were in jungle so thick you could barely see 10 feet.

Other times we were in areas that resembled New England in the winter, due to Agent Orange stripping all of the foliage from the trees -can you believe we were told the stuff would not harm us!

I was put on TDY (temporary duty) with the 18th MP Brigade -- the unit operating the PBRs in Quin Nhon Harbor.

This was an MP unit because their primary mission was seen as a police action.

Our duties were basically to keep the civilian population of Quin Nhon from stealing everything that was unloaded in the harbor and intended for the U.S. Army and the war effort. Quin Nhon had a huge harbor at that time, as the U.S. was still building up its forces in Vietnam, and the 18th MP Brigade operated five PBRs from a small dock just behind the waterfront proper.

The day I arrived at the unit, its strength was just about 25 strong. Our detachment was a staff commander sergeant E6.

My rank at that time was E4, and because of my timein-grade, I was placed as the second-highest ranking man there.

My remaining time in Vietnam was spent on and around the water of Quin Nhon Harbor.

We kept two PBRs crewed and active both day and night. We worked two 12-hour shifts per day, including a 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. day shift and a 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. night shift.

After the first couple of days assigned as an engineer on one of the boats, I was asked to take the night shift as a night duty officer.

My position kept me in and around our command/radio shack all night, which was located on shore at the end of our dock.

I made sure the radio operator stayed awake all night and that the radio logs were kept current. The two PBRs active on each shift were crewed by four soldiers - yes, soldiers. not sailors!

Each boat had a coxswain, an engineer, a bow gunner and a stern gunner.

The coxswain was in command of the boat and made all decisions while on the water. The engineer was in charge

of keeping the boat operating. The gunners manned the boats armament, which consisted of twin fifties up front -- a pair of electrically aimed and fired 50-caliber machines -- Ma Duce x 2.

The guy in back had a pedestal-mounted M60 belt-fed 7.62 machine gun, as well as a hand-cranked 40mm grenade launcher that operated very similar to Mr. Gatlin's machine gun from the Civil War.

Each man had his own personal M16 and a 1911 Colt 45 automatic pistol as well.

All in all, these 34-foot fiberglass boats packed a very nasty punch.
