Volunteers needed for post-season scallop count

The county Extension Office is seeking volunteers for the first post-season scallop count in four years, which will be conducted on

The event, hosted by the Taylor County Extension University Office, Florida, Florida Sea Grant and the Florida Fish and Conservation

Commission (FWC), will be a volunteer-based collection of data, which will be used to estimate remaining scallop population after the 2021 season closes on Labor Day, Sept. 6.

Locals can get involved by bringing their boat to take surveyors out, assisting on a boat or snorkeling or scuba diving to count scallops themselves.

"FWC-Research Institute molluscan specialists have created a one-squaremile grid along all of the coast, with sampling sites selected randomly to avoid any bias in the results. We have been in direct contact with the research group, they already preselected 100 sampling sites between Dixie and Taylor," UF Marine Agent Victor Blanco said.

"All registered volunteers in the activity will receive a link to a short video explaining the forms to use and the methodology, and the day of the count we will have a short introduction and set up a scenario on the ground to clarify any doubt," Blanco said.

FWC made the decision to host a post-season scallop count for 2021 -as opposed to a pre-season scallop count -- to better determine season dates and limits.

"FWC determined (in the first post-season count in 2018) that to have a healthy scallop population during one season, it is fundamental to have at least 2.5 million scallops left in the previous season," Blanco said.

"Those scallops are responsible for spawning and producing the new generation spats, juveniles and future adults to be harvested the following year," Blanco continued.

Currently, recreational bay scallop season runs from June 15 to Labor Day (Sept. 6) off the coast of the majority of Taylor County.

The daily bag limits are two gallons of whole bay scallops in the shell or one pint of shucked bay scallop meat per person, with a maximum of 10 gallons of whole bay scallops in the shell or 1/2 gallon (4 pints) shucked bay scallop meat per vessel. Throughout the season and region-wide, vessel limits do not allow an individual to exceed their personal bag limit.

The season dates and limits have previously been determined by the FWC's pre-season counts.

"Pre-season just gave us a sense of how many scallops were available for harvesting for the season. Previously, they estimated that a count of 0.1 to 1 scallop per square meter meant a healthy population, and Taylor County was always above or just at the lower range," Blanco explained.

Continuing, he said, "The starting population was estimated between 10 and 15 million scallops. Of those, some were subject to natural mortality and others to fishing mortality, and the remaining was considered

the spawning population." The abundant scallop grounds off Steinhatchee and Keaton Beach bring in an estimated \$3-5 million each summer, as thousands of people flock to the


Taylor County coast. "The recreational harvesting of scallops in Taylor County has been established as a very important -- if not the most important -- economic activity on the coast during summertime," Blanco said.

"To accomplish the goal of estimating the most accurate scallop population, it is fundamental to go in the water and survey those random sites and count scallops," Blanco continued. As scallop season will

be closed to the area at the time of the count, no scallops will be harvested -- only counted. Register at Eventbrite.
