

Perry continued to explore the possibility of purchasing property for a new well and water treatment plant.

• Local law enforcement agencies working alongside Lafayette the County Sheriff's Office, the North Star Drug Task Force and the DEA (Drug Enforcement Administration) were instrumental in an investigation that led to the arrest and subsequent conviction of Harvey Jennings Starling, 56, of Branford on federal drug distribution charges.

• When Taylor County teachers began receiving individual evaluations from their site administrators, some expressed concern upon learning that 50% of their "proficiency score" was based on student "growth rate" (as determined by test scores) from the previous year.



• Hurricane Helene, the strongest tropical system ever to strike the Big Bend – and the third hurricane to make landfall in Taylor County in the past 13 months -- left behind unprecedented devastation, damaging or destroying up to 90% of the structures along the county's coastal communities. The hurricane made landfall just east of the mouth of the Aucilla River around 11:10 p.m. on Sept. 26, battering the county with 140 mph sustained winds and gusts up to 160 mph, but it was the estimated 15 to 17 feet of storm surge that caused the most destruction.

• In what was believed to be the first time Taylor County had ever been visited by a sitting U.S. president, local officials hosted President Joe Biden, Senator Rick Scott, the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Deputy FEMA and Administrator on a tour of some of the hardest-hit areas along the Taylor County coast, which sustained more than \$50 million in damages according to preliminary estimates. Biden issued "Presidential Disaster а Declaration" increasing the federal government's share of disaster relief from 75% to 100%, saving Taylor County and the state of Florida millions of dollars.

• Contractors paid by FDOT began picking up and hauling storm debris just days after Hurricane Helene hammered Taylor County with 100-plus mph

winds. Ceres Environmental Services, Inc. began working around the clock to clear the road to recovery by removing vegetative debris, destroyed homes and other hurricane debris using 42 huge, tandem self-loading debris trucks outfitted with custom-built knuckle-boom loaders.

• Tri-County Electric Cooperative worked non-stop to complete the process of rebuilding its infrastructure destroyed by the high winds and record storm surge caused by Hurricane Helene.

 More than 30 emergency housing trailers were delivered and picked up by those displaced by Hurricane Helene, as some 250-300 homes in Taylor County were either destroyed or rendered uninhabitable by the storm.

• Fresh off the devastation left behind by Hurricane Helene, local emergency officials were keeping a wary (and weary) eye on Hurricane Milton, which was projected to hit the west coast of Florida near Tampa. Traffic on Highway 19 through Taylor County was bumper-to-bumper as millions of residents from the Tampa area and South → Please see page 10

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
